16.00 Rennie Collection Gallery

One of Vancouver's newer art spaces is located in one of its most historic buildings. The Rennie gallery is housed in a Victorian heritage conversion by local architect Walter Francl, with interiors by Michael Green of MGB, originally built in 1889 for Chinese-Canadian businessman Yip Sang. An elevated passageway links this to a 1912 building, which accommodated Sang's large family. The gallery fills both

structures. An invitation to one of its opening parties, held in the rooftop garden, where a Thomas Housego bronze statue stands next to a glass-and-steel pavilion by Dan Graham (opposite), are sought after.
